## From the Music Stand.....

Friends, I've had a grand time doing research on how contemporary Christian music has evolved. Remember, "contemporary" is another word for "modern" music of the day. We saw the progression of artists who moved and created with the times, which artists used the Christian format to push their own agendas, and which ones God touched throughout the years.

With the coming of the 1990's, Christian contemporary music continued to evolve. The music became more scripture based instead of having a "hook" to get the listener pulled in. Artists such as Chris Tomlin ("How Great is Our God"), Michael W. Smith ("Place In This World"), and Mercy Me ("I Can Only Imagine") were prominent. The availability of videos has heightened our worship experience. These performer/composers have helped us to continue to worship our God with songs that lead us to the very heart of worship which is defined as: "The inner essence of worship is to know God truly and then to respond from the heart to that knowledge by valuing God, treasuring God, prizing God, enjoying God, being satisfied with God above all earthly things."

As the century turned to the 2000's, Big Daddy Weave ("Every Time I Breathe", "Redeemed"), Third Day ("God of Wonders"), and Stephen Curtis Chapman ("All Things New") are continuing to give us songs of worship and praise. The use of studio and video tracks being made available to the public has allowed church members to be able to lead solo and congregational praise songs.

We are now into the 2010's and we continue to have the same performers bring new songs of worship to the forefront. Sometimes, the older hymns we grew up with are merged together: Shane & Shane ("Come Thou Fount"/"Above All Else"), Chris Tomlin ("O Worship the King"/"You Shine in the Light") and Matthew West ("Blessed Assurance"/"My King is Coming"). These updates allow us to sing the songs of our faith incorporated with newer songs that blend seamlessly.

In the present 2020's, we have almost come full circle and are "recycling" some of our 70- and 80-year-old songs of worship with a more contemporary soundtrack which appeals to a younger age group of worshipers who are "discovering" songs of faith. The bottom line, my friends, is that when we sing, we are praising and worshiping our Heavenly Father. Remember, we are to praise with our lips, with harp, tambourine, and instruments. Our God wants to hear from us in all situations; I believe He truly enjoys our songs of praise.
