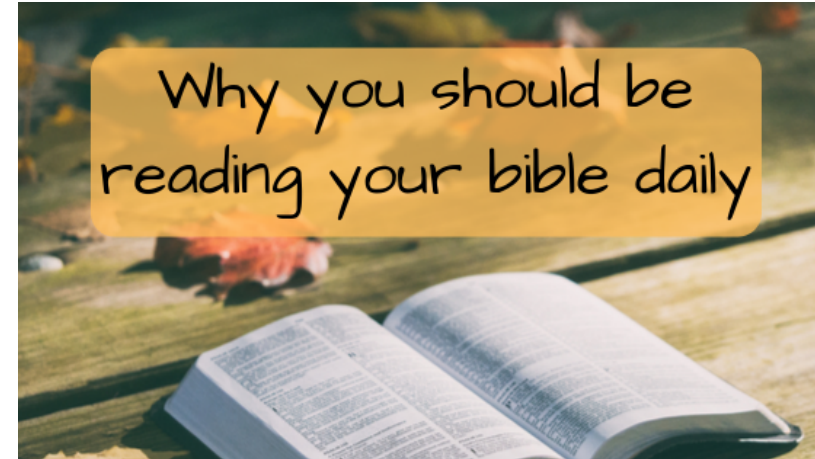

other accountable to your promise to spend more time studying God's word.

Here are seven reasons to read your Bible:

1. It strengthens your relationship with God. "Bible reading opens a daily conversation between you and your Savior, in which you get to know Him better and He continues to love you more than you can imagine."
2. It feeds and transforms you. "The Holy Scriptures have a powerful way of guiding you toward becoming the person God created you to be."
3. It equips you with wisdom for living. God's word is just as pertinent today as it was when it was written. It gives you "practical tools for living your life in the here and now."
4. It sets an example for those you love. "Watching a loved one have a strong Bible reading habit makes it far more likely that those who see it will develop their own love of reading the Bible every day too."
5. You will discover your role in God's plan. "God has a plan for the world, and you are an integral part of that plan."
6. Your prayerfulness, fruitfulness, and discipleship will grow. "God's word does "not return to [Him] empty" (Isaiah 55:11), but rather produces great fruit in the lives of those who read and live it."
