Fun Facts About Lent

- The word "Lent" is derived from the word "lencten" which means "spring."
- Have you ever noticed the Lenten season actually lasts 46 days? Why, you might ask?

Lent will begin on Ash Wednesday, February 22nd, this year and last until Holy Saturday, which always occurs the day before Easter, on April 8th. Lent is a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's resurrection on Easter Sunday, April 9th. Sundays are not included in the count, hence Lent lasting 40 days, not 46.

- 40 days is a significant number in Jewish-Christian traditions.

Lent is a 40-day season of prayer and, for some, sacrifice. It marks the 40 days that Jesus spent fasting in the desert, enduring temptations from Satan. 40 days also represents the duration of the Great Flood in the book of Genesis, it is the amount of time Moses spent in the wilderness before receiving the Ten Commandments, and it is the number of days the Hebrews spent in the desert before reaching the Promised Land.

colonists liked better when Newton arrived in the Americas. This song of God's saving grace has become a world-wide favorite for the way it speaks to so many changed hearts, especially in times of trial.

Another song, coming from an unexpected source, is one made popular by singer/songwriter Barry Manilow, though he did not compose the song. When approached by his manager to record it, he initially turned it down; he did not want the listeners to get the impression that he was being egotistical due to the lyrics:

I've been alive forever
And I wrote the very first song.
I put the words and the melodies together,
I am Music and I write the songs.
My home lies deep within you
And I've got my own place in your soul.
Now when I look out through your eyes

I'm young again, even though I'm very old.

Manilow's manager told him to contact the composer for the back story. Upon speaking with Bruce Johnston of The Beach Boys, Manilow was told the "I" refers to the Creator of the Universe. After hearing this, Manilow realized how potent the lyrics were and sang them even more from the heart.

Music that moves us to dance, to weep, to be joyful or to heal our spirits will not speak to every individual, every time, or even in the same way consistently, but we need to be aware that it **does** communicate to someone. I want to encourage you to consider the reason some songs are sung in various settings and wonder who it might touch.

From the Music Stand.....


Have you ever considered what needs to occur to give birth to a song? What was the reason or the catalyst for its creation? This is not like any of the Taylor Swift songs where her inspiration came from her relationship, or not, with a boyfriend. We tend to either like or dislike a song because of how it makes **us** feel. We then try to project our impression of the song on to others. I want to offer you three different songs and how they came into being.

You are familiar with the hymn, "It Is Well with My Soul" by Horatio Spafford. He wrote the lyrics after the death of his children. Spafford was a prominent and successful Chicago attorney with many business properties. Just prior to the Great Chicago Fire, where he lost almost all his investment properties, he lost his only son. In an attempt to give his family a much-needed respite, he sent his wife and four remaining daughters to Europe. Before he could sail to join them, he received a telegram from his wife stating, "saved alone." The ship the family was sailing on had been wrecked and the mother was the only survivor of the family. Spafford sailed to join his wife and at the location of the shipwreck, he was moved to write the words to this beloved hymn. From Horatio Spafford's greatest time of trial and heartache came a song that testifies to the salvation he found in Jesus Christ; it carried him through the best and worst times of his life and has given many of us a musical venue through which we may also worship.

The words to the world-wide favorite song, "Amazing Grace," came into being when John Newton, a slave trader, was lashed to the steering wheel of his slave ship; he fought a raging storm for eleven hours and survived. While the waves washed many of the sailors overboard and several of the slaves were also drowned, Newton cried out for God to have mercy on him. From then on, Newton set aside March 21 as a day of reflection and prayer. Newton went on to become a prominent abolitionist against the slave trade. The tune, originally set to an English song, was changed to one that the
