than they gave, but to give for a specific purpose, for a designated time. Sacrificial giving is giving for the love of another. This is a tangible act of worship and devotion to God. It is giving beyond your means (sacrifice) for an immediate need that will ultimately bring joy because it is pointed to the Kingdom.

Microtia is a birth defect which affects the ear. Depending on the severity, or lack of the external ear growth, it can affect the hearing of a child. In turn, this affects the child's speech and, at times, his/her ability to learn because he/she does not hear as others do.

As many of you know, Cody Longoria suffers from this condition. At this time, we still do not have the exact amount that will be required for a prosthetic ear for Cody. It could cost anywhere from \$8,000 to \$28,000, depending on what is required.

Consider all the ways the Father has blessed you. Spend time in family discussion and prayer and allow the spirit of God to show you how you can give sacrificially. Remember to do all things in prayer.



From the Music Stand.....

Everyone has heard the old saying, "Music soothes the savage beast." Well, there is more to the quote; the phrase has been misquoted. In actuality, the quote reads "Music has charms to soothe the savage breast." It is a line from the poem *The Mourning Bride* which was written in 1697. The British poet, William Congreve, originally wrote: "Musick has Charms to sooth a savage Breast, To soften Rocks, or bend a knotted Oak." The phrase means that music can calm even the most ferocious of people. It is often used to describe how music can have a calming effect on people who are angry or upset.

Music also can, and is, used in medical practices. Scripture tells us "Whenever the evil spirit from God came on Saul, David would take up the lyre and play. Then relief would come to Saul; he would feel better, and the evil spirit would leave him." (1 Samuel 16:23) Hospitals are using music therapy to help in the mental relief experienced by cancer patients or those who have to withstand extended stays in the hospital. The powerful benefits of music are relaxation, the lowering of blood pressure and pain, improved sleep quality, and improved memory and mental alertness. All these benefits have been documented.

Now that you've learned all the benefits music can provide, let's see how this relates to our singing prayers and praises to our Lord. Recall your darkest times. Do you remember if you were saying prayers out loud, or if you were singing songs of prayer silently in your head? For me, the songs and hymns that I had sung as a youth, or in the sanctuary choir, those are the songs that came into my head. I was singing these songs of Jesus so strongly, in my heart and head, because I was not able to verbalize them aloud. This music came from my soul; I know it reached out and the Lord heard it because I am able to share this story with you. My God is so very real and even when I had stepped away, He was there waiting for me to see His hand working in my life.

When you find yourself in a "mood," try to find a song that has the ability to


